



UCSF Medical Center at Mission Bay Local Hiring for Construction

The UCSF Medical Center at Mission Bay broke ground in December 2010 on a \$1.5 billion, 289-bed, integrated hospital complex to serve children, women and cancer patients on the campus' 57-acre biomedical campus at Mission Bay. This \$1.5 billion hospital complex is setting a world-class standard for patient- and family-centered health care, safety and sustainability. Additionally, these hospitals will speed the application of scientific discoveries to the treatment of patients in the Bay Area and beyond, furthering UCSF's *advancing health worldwide*[™] mission.

Commitment to Local Hiring

UCSF is committed to developing and maintaining relationships with the neighborhoods that house its campuses and has a history of collaboration with its neighbors. As the second largest employer in the city and a major factor in the health of the city's overall economy, UCSF recognizes that the construction of the UCSF Medical Center at Mission Bay can financially benefit the neighborhoods around the campus, as well as the entire city. As such, UCSF is firmly committed to creating job opportunities for hiring San Francisco residents to help build the Mission Bay hospital project.

Local Hiring for UCSF Medical Center at Mission Bay

UCSF will work with DPR Construction, Inc., the project's general contractor, to ensure that qualified San Francisco residents – including those from neighborhoods closest to the project site – have access to the hospitals' construction jobs.

UCSF will voluntarily work toward a goal of reaching 20 percent San Francisco residents of the project's total workforce in year one followed by a 5 percent increase per year through the completion of the project in 2014. These goals, if reached, would more than double UCSF's historical average. UCSF's aim is to: strengthen Mission Bay's economic contributions to the community; increase employment opportunities for San Francisco residents and engage local unions in innovative partnerships. Clearly, UCSF cannot reach these goals alone. Rather, success requires the commitment of the broader community and the trade unions.

UCSF will monitor and issue regular public reports on the status of local hiring on the project. Updates can also be found on the project's website, www.missionbayhospitals.ucsf.edu.

Current Activities and Next Steps

Ongoing monthly communication between the community and UCSF occurs to: discuss upcoming milestones; review local resident hiring goals, process, and progress, and share ideas to develop related UCSF/Community partnerships.
